A place where emerald-colour water of Lake Balaton is painted by sunlight, and the thousand-times seen, yet still amazing buttes gently line the lakeside like a pearl necklace; where Somló Hill dominates the landscape near the slopes of the Mountain Bakony as God's forgotten hat; where Kis-Balaton, a huge wetland habitat with a unique waterfowl population can be found, where fabulously named villages such as Vindornyaszőlős, Csörnyeföld, or Garabonc hide among the hillocks; where the sun ripens grapes on more than 9,000 hectares – this scenic area with rich history and natural beauties is the Balaton Wine Region.

Balaton Wine Region is a home to several ancient and unique Hungarian grape varieties, among them Kéknyelű is found exclusively at Badacsony in the world, indeed, witness mountain Somló is a real home of Juhfark as well. A Balaton wine is light, playful or even robust, thought-provoking, indeed, it can be bone-dry or simply lush with floral or pleasantly spicy notes, or even explosively fruity, sweet or tart, in fact, sometimes salty as well, depending on the terroir.

5 UNMISSABLE EXPERIENCES

1.

Have a fresh fried pike-perch or zander at a lakeside bistro and drink a glass of local Olaszrizling.

2.

Get on a sailboat from the port of Balatonboglár to the open water, have a glass of light red wine from the southern part of the lake, and admire the enchanting lights of the sunset in your drink.

3.

Discover Kis-Balaton by boat or on a bike, and at the end of the tour taste a great Traminer from the Zala Wine District.

4.

Climb up the Somló Hill, admire the untouched nature from the hilltop, then settle down on a terrace of a cellar there, and wait for the night to discover the wonders of the light-free sky with a glass of Juhfark.

5.

By sitting on the Rózsakő, a famous basalt block of Badacsony Hill, immerse yourself in the natural beauty of the landscape while sipping some Rózsakő wine made by a local winemaker.
